

CREDIT RIVER TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 12

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE APPROACHES
TO PUBLIC ROADWAYS

THE TOWNSHIP OF CREDIT RIVER ORDAINS:

SECTION I. Purpose and Interpretation.

In order to provide for the safe use of the township public roads and cartways and their appurtenances and the public use thereof, it is necessary for the Town Board of Supervisors to require permits and regulations for owners who intend to locate a private roadway with access onto the township roads and cartways. Appurtenances shall include culverts or other drainage facilities in order to prevent piping, erosion, silting, flooding, or other damages caused by inadequate drainage or improper location of a drainage facility. In their interpretation and application, the provisions of these regulations and the issuance of permits for direct private access to an abutting roadway or cartway shall be consistent with the intent and authority granted to Townships under Minn. Stat. §160.18 Subd. 3.

SECTION II. Location.

The Town Board of Supervisors shall determine where private access to a township roadway shall be made. A township roadway shall by definition include cartways and streets whether or not they are located within or outside platted areas. The angle, height, width, roadbase materials, culvert installation, if any, and slope shall be approved before a permit is granted to contract a private access road joining with an abutting township roadway.

SECTION III. Necessity.

A second private access roadway serving one residence and its accessory buildings shall be prohibited. Exception shall be made for agricultural purposes where it can be demonstrated that access with farm machinery to crop or grazing land, including meadows used for pasture or hay, requires additional private direct access driveways.

SECTION IV. Permit.

No private access roadway shall be constructed without obtaining a permit from the Town Board of Supervisors. The permit issued to a landowner shall contain whatever conditions the town board deems necessary to be imposed by the regulations in this ordinance which the applicant agrees to perform. At the time the permit is issued by the Clerk, a permit fee of \$ _____ shall be paid.

This Ordinance shall become effective from and after the date of its publication according to law.

Adopted and passed by a majority of the Town Board this 16 day of December, 1991.

At the time the permit is issued by the Clerk, a permit fee of \$325.00 shall be paid.
